

Frequently Asked Questions

Why doesn't my child in Juniors have a reading book? In Juniors, they are heard read aloud regularly in Class, they also complete Guided Reading and Shared Reading lessons every week. When pupils pick up a book to read at home we hope it is for the pleasure of reading not for homework. Pupils will have the opportunity to visit our fabulous school library and check out a book every week.

Why has my child changed Lexia level? At the start of every year Lexia auto places the pupils to the level where it assesses the pupil's reading ability to be.

Should I help my child with their homework? Please support your child by helping them to schedule suitable times to do their homework, but the tasks themselves should be **completed independently**. If the homework is too hard, see the class teacher.

What if I haven't got a device for my child to complete their homework on? Please let the class teacher know and they will arrange for an alternative time or an alternative task for the pupil.

How can I motivate my child to do their homework? Finding a suitable regular time is vital, such as straight after school on a Mon, Wed and Fri. Setting up that routine makes it easier to keep. Remind them that homework at High School is going to hugely increase in volume so it's good to get into a positive habit now. Celebrate any certificates they bring home.
