Dear Parents / Carers,

Homework in the Juniors at Venerable Edward Morgan RC Primary School (VEM)

We want pupils to be given the opportunity to enhance their learning completed at VEM with these homework tasks and applications. They can give the pupils a chance to improve scores, learn time management and develop self-discipline.

Here are the weekly tasks: -

- 1. The most important homework we set at VEM is **reading**. Each week we encourage your child to choose a book from the VEM library to take home and enjoy.
- We ask pupils to complete the Lexia Core 5 Reading programme for three twenty-minute sessions a week. This is a personalised reading programme with an excellent track record for improving pupil's reading skills.
- 3. **RM** easi Maths is to be completed for three ten-minute sessions a week. This covers a range of mathematical topics, allowing pupils to build up their mental fluency and develop their number experiences.
- 4. We also recommend pupils use the **J2Blast Section** on their **hwb account** for practising spellings and timetables. These should be practised for short but frequent sessions. Here, pupils can use the practise mode to build confidence or go live against others across the world to test their skills.

The timings above are recommendations. Some pupils prefer to set out one evening to complete all of their tasks, others like to do their homework each day before breakfast. This is something you, as a parent / carer, can greatly help with, assisting your child in finding what works for them.

Moving forwards: -

- Starting next week and every week going forward, pupils who complete **Lexia Core 5** and **RM** easi **Maths** will be given a ticket to enter a termly prize draw.
- Homework Club for all Juniors will begin on Thursday 19th September 2024 and every Thursday
 after school, from home time until 4.30 pm. The club will take place in Dosbarth Maple. This
 will give pupils opportunity for access to devices and time to complete their homework.
